

What is acupuncture?

One of the oldest forms of therapy (rooted in Chinese philosophy) whereby tiny stainless steel needles are inserted into the skin.

What is a Meridian?

The highways in which vital energy flows through the body (made up of acupuncture points).

What is Qi?


Qi is the sensation felt during acupuncture (subjective fullness, warmth, numbness, and tingling).

Who can provide acupuncture?

Any licensed healthcare provider who has taken additional education, training, and testing required by their regulator.



How does Acupuncture help?







Decrease pain by local and systemic hormone release



How do you choose the points?

Local	Shu	Influential
These points are chosen based on local structures related to your pain and can include any meridian close to the site of pain.	These distal points are chosen based on the meridian in which you are experiencing pain.	There are 3 Influential Points: UB11 (bone/spine/joint) GB39 (nerve) GB34 (muscle/tendon/lig)
