#### What is a topical analgesic?

A topical is a cream or lotion used during manual therapy. A topical analgesic is one that provides pain relief as well.

#### When do you use it?

Topicals are used to promote a decrease in pain or to provide lubrication as an emollient during hands-on therapy.

#### What kinds do you have?

We have unscented/no sensation emollient, Dual Action Medistik (hot/cold sensation), and Ice Therapy Medistik (cold sensation), and organic mint body lotion.



# How do TOPICALS help?



Decreases pain by using the gate control theory (counter-irritant)



Decrease pain by increasing blood flow (vasodilation)



Prevent injury (pulling) to skin during manual therapy
